TRANSFIGURATION

Rev. Mark T. Wuggazer

Significance of the Transfiguration:

1. The visible transfiguration of Jesus reveals that He is more than just a good man and a good teacher.
2. His association with Moses and Elijah identifies Him as the Messiah.
3. The Voice from heaven identifies Him as the Son of God.
4. He is both 100% God and 100% Man at the same time.

Significance of Moses:

1. Reminds us of when Moses went up on a mountain to meet with God and saw the Glory of God.
2. Moses was considered to be the greatest person of the Old Testament. By appearing here he becomes officially 'subservient' to Jesus. Jesus is pronounced greater than Moses.
4. All Jews who looked forward to the Messiah connected Him to Moses.

Significance of Elijah:

1. The Old Testament prophet Malachi said that Elijah would return before the Messiah.
2. Elijah in the Old Testament suffered at the hands of the ungodly for being God's mouthpiece.
3. All Jews who looked forward to the Messiah connected Him to Elijah.

Connections between the Transfiguration and the Baptism of Jesus:

1. Jesus was present.
2. Voice of God was present saying virtually the same thing.
3. Holy Spirit was present.
